The Center is home to over 40 wolves: gray wolves, critically endangered red wolves and Mexican gray wolves. Other resident animals include: black bears, foxes, lynx, coyote, skunks, raccoons, New Guinea Highland dogs, birds of prey, and a porcupine.

Wolf Day Camp

Adventure and fun should be a part of every child's summer. Wolf Day Campers will participate in a unique outdoor experience where wolves, black bears, coyotes, foxes, skunks, lynx and raptors become the teachers during a week of wild fun. Each five day session is filled with wildlife activities, radio telemetry, archery, games and crafts. **Cost: \$210.00 whole day/\$105 half day**



Session A: July 20-24 Wildlife Forensics I

Are you interested in CSI? Do you like solving mysteries? This camp focuses on science skills used to determine the sequence of events involved in wildlife "crime scenes". Labs include: information from bones, deductive reasoning, fingerprint analysis, and more. 8:30-4:00 **Ages 8-15**

Session B: July 27-31 Wonders of Wildlife

How do they do that? How do animals interact? How does weather affect animals and plants? These questions and more will be answered by hands-on experiments and daily observations of the world around you. 8:30-4:00 **Ages 8-15**

Session C: Aug. 3-7 Wildlife Forensics II

Discover other ways to help solve mysteries! This camp is a continuation of our study of cool forensic science techniques. Labs include: hair analysis, shoe track analysis, DNA analysis, and more. 8:30-4:00 **Ages 8-15**

Session D1: Aug. 10-14 New Campers 8:30-11:30am

This half-day morning camp is especially designed for the young camper in your family. Every day we will meet from 8:30-11:30 to explore the wildlife at the WSC with lots of cool hands-on crafts, games, and activities. **Ages: 6-8**

Session D2: Aug. 10-14 Advanced Camp 1-4pm

This half-day afternoon advanced camp will interest the scientist in your family. Explore Wildlife Management techniques, hands-on data collection, animal adaptations, and help behind the scenes with animal care at the WSC. **Ages 12-18**

Overnight Wolf Camp

Overnight camp-three days and two nights of fun-filled learning about plants and animals at the Wildlife Science Center. Learn hands-on techniques used by biologists to study your local environment and the diversity of predator prey relationships. This Monday through Wednesday camp experience teaches radio telemetry tracking techniques, archery skills, animal and plant identification, hands-on science data collection and much more. We will be spending one night at the Linwood location and one night at the Columbus site. This program will be great for the wildlife biologist or outdoor enthusiast in your family. The maximum number of campers is 18 per session and will fill first come, first serve.
